## GRAND KNIGHT’S GREETING

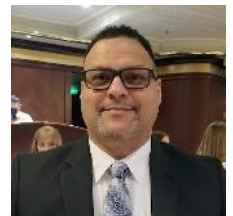
I hope everyone had a blessed Father’s Day!

In his letter, Cardinal Dolan writes, "WYD 2023 is an opportunity for young people throughout the world to gather and experience the transformative power of our Catholic faith, through prayer, catechesis and fellowship each day, to visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima and other pilgrimage sites, and to pray with our Lord in Adoration—led by Pope Francis. You will be able to experience how truly universal our Church is, while being challenged by all that comes with embarking on a pilgrim-

age and growing in faith with fellow young adults, priests and other spiritual leaders.

"The theme for this year is *Mary arose and went with haste*. (Lk 1:39) What an appropriate theme, helping us to meditate and contemplate our own personal spiritual lives and the role you and I can play in helping shape the future of our Church. ...

"I've seen the transformative power of World Youth Days up close; rarely do those who attend return home unchanged, more deeply committed to their faith. If you're a young adult of our Archdiocese, why not take that bold step into the arms of Jesus and Mary in Portugal. Your presence and your witness can echo for generations to come. To my fellow priests and ministry leaders, I invite you to consider sharing this message with the young adults in your communities. Encourage them and keep them in your prayers.
